Sunrise Readers Book 5 We Come and Go

Teachers and Parents – here are some follow-up activities you can use with Sunrise Readers Book 5 – We Come and Go.

The teacher has prepared the learner for each story by introducing and drilling the relevant sight words in advance.

Preview the story:

It is always good practice to *preview a story* before reading it:

- Read the title of the story talk about what this suggests the story may be about.
- Look at the pictures, and discuss with questions and answers, for example:
- Q Who is in this story?
- Q Where are they?
- Q What are they doing?
- Q Why are they doing this?
- Q What do you think might happen next?

Read through the story with the child/children. This can be done in a number of ways:

- a The child reads the story to you.
- b Shared reading: You read a sentence or two, and the child reads the next sentence or two.
- c You read the story aloud together, at the same time.
- d Children read the story together in a group of three or four, taking it in turns to read a sentence or two.

You might talk about the story once you have finished reading it. Ideas:

- Ask the children to tell the story back to you. and/or
- Q Do **you** do this? or Have you ever done this?
- O Do you like this story? Say why or why not.

Once the story has been read and discussed:

Write the following **Do this:** activities on the board. Go through the instructions carefully with the children. Ensure they understand what to do.

You may or may not want to use the following symbols instead of instruction words:

- ? Means "talk about".
- means "draw"

Pages 1 – 3 Let us go to the farm.

Please note: We introduce the **PAST TENSE** in Book 5.

Teacher – talk about past tense. It's often useful to give lots of examples, using **yesterday.** e.g. Is it correct to say

Yesterday Father was please \rightarrow pleased with the work I did.

Talk about the boats – three questions are about the *energy* that makes boats go, (a person, wind and fuel); two questions are about what those boats are used for, (a kapenta fishing rig and a cargo/ container carrier) and the final question extends the learner's general knowledge – it is a submarine. Encourage the children to ask questions – to think about what a submarine is and why someone might want a submarine? what submarines are used for – mainly for military purposes (a country's navy – they can travel in secret or be used in a war to fire torpedoes to sink other ships) OR used for research under the sea. Always try to involve children in engaging with a topic – e.g. Which of these boats would **you** like to go on? Why? Etc.

Pages 59 – 61 The library

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- What is in a library? * Do you have a library at school?
- What books do you like to read?

Pages 62 – 63 A talk-about page – What to do with books

This is a good activity to do with the whole class. Look at the pictures and read together. Talk about WHY we should or should not do these things.
